

## Data Integration

You can set up data integration between Schoology and your Student Information System via export out of your SIS into comma-separated value (CSV) files. You can then import this data manually, or schedule it to import automatically into Schoology on a periodic basis. This document describes the types of data that can be imported, and the requirements for each corresponding CSV file.

All files require column headers. See sample data and sample CSV files. Note that the Schoology administrative interface allows you to flexibly map column headers, so using the headers depicted in this document is not a requirement.

### Users

The users file creates and updates Schoology users.

Username	Yes *	If you are setting up Single-Sign-On, the Username, E-mail, or Unique User ID field values must match a corresponding field in your identity provider.

Field	Required?	Notes
Unique User ID	Yes	Must be unique across the entire institution, including across roles. If IDs are not unique across role, then we recommend prepending <b>1_</b> for students, <b>2_</b> for instructors, and so on.
Role	Yes	Should correlate to values in your SIS. Examples: system administrator, instructor, student.
School	Yes	This will determine the school the user is associated with. All users can be associated with the same school. <b>Examples:</b> Springfield College, Fairfield University, Undergraduate, Graduate.
Schoolology User ID	No	This field is generally ONLY used in special cases to update users exported and reimported to Schoolology.
Position/Job Title	No	
Password	No	
Gender	No	Acceptable values: <b>M, Male, F, Female</b> Once you've added Gender as a field to a user's account, you cannot hide it from the public profile. Additionally, you cannot automatically remove the field via import; that is, you can't overwrite the gender field with a blank value and must complete these updates manually if you do not wish this information to display in the user's public profile. Before adding gender information to your import file, be sure you want that information included in your users' public profiles.
Grad Year	Recommended	Although Grad Year is not required, including it in import files makes the end of year process much easier to manage.
Additional Schools	No	Additional schools should be separated with pipes( ). <b>Note:</b> Assigning additional schools is not a requirement for enrolling students in courses offered in multiple schools; instead it determines access to shared resources, announcements, etc.

## Courses

The courses file creates course shells. Please note that the courses file does not create course content. Content will either be created in the course shell or migrated to the course shell from a Legacy LMS.

Course Code	Yes	May not be used across multiple schools. If a course does span multiple schools, please prepend a unique school identifier (for example, <b>123_PSY101</b> , where <b>123</b> is the unique School ID).

Course Description	No	
Section Name	Yes	
Section School Code	<b>Yes *</b>	Global unique identifier for the section - must be unique across all courses and sections in the institution, cannot be repeated.
Section Code	<b>Yes *</b>	Section Code is used if you cannot generate global unique identifiers. However, if you use section code, then the combination of Course Code, Section Code, and Grading Period must be unique.
Section Description	No	
Location	No	
School Building	Yes	
Grading Periods	Yes	Standard 'term'. Multiple grading periods should be separated with pipes ( ) - see sample data.

## Course Section Enrollment

The enrollments file enrolls users into course sections (linking imported users to imported course shells).

### Available Fields

\* - **Either/or**. Must match the field used in the course provisioning file.

Field	Required?	Notes
Course Code	Yes	The combination of Course Code and Section Code identifies the specific course in which the user is enrolled.
Section Code	<b>Yes*</b>	
Section School Code	<b>Yes*</b>	May not be used across multiple schools. If a course does span multiple schools, please prepend a unique school identifier (for example, <b>123_PSY101</b> , where <b>123</b> is the unique School ID).
User Unique ID	Yes	Identifies the enrolled user.
Role	Yes	Indicates instructor/student for the course. Designates administrators for the section.  <b>Note:</b> Users imported as instructors can be students in sections, and vice-versa.
Grading Periods	Yes	Standard 'term'. Multiple grading periods should be separated with pipes ( ) - see sample data.  <b>Note:</b> Grading Periods are <b>not</b> required in the Course Enrollments file if the Courses file is using Section School Code. Required if Courses file uses Section Code.

## Course Section Cross-Listing

If you wish multiple course sections (for example, a section listed in multiple departments) appear as one unified course section in Schoolology, you can import a cross-listing file.
